






Dafne Keen Elsie Fisher

Hector Villalobos

The two men may be more alike than they know as both seek peace through power.



Jose Margalles

Jose served with John overseas and was nearly burned to death when John failed to kill a ten year old boy strapped with a bomb meant to kill the team. As a civilian, he made the choice to heal others. He runs a "Wellness Center" which helps treat those with PTSD. As a spiritual guru to John, he's also John's most haunting ghost.



'Tino' Villalobos

Tino is the entitled prince of the cartel who acts with his heart instead of his mind. Impulsive and rash, he will stop at nothing in his quest for power and to overtake his father. He has no moral compass and therefore has no qualms about human trafficking.



Ashley Medoza

'Ash' helps John run the gym. She's a veteran and aspiring MMA fighter with a dark and troubled past. With a history of sexual abuse and drug use, she uses fighting as an outlet for her rage. She's also an additional conduit for dealing with PTSD.



Frank Schaffer

Frank was trained by the paramilitary wing CIA who moved into darker operations within the deep state. He's John's go-to guy. He's cut all ties with the deep state and as John's 'mechanic,' he makes things happen by leveraging old relationships and other less than savory means.



Mark Martinez

Mark is the former special ops, hightech guru of the bunch with ties to active operators across the globe. He brings an unflinching perspective that challenges norms on how some look at relations between the people of Mexico and the U.S.



Patrick Macleod

NSA special agent who has hired John in the past to do what the government cannot officially do. He is John's connection to information and power but he's also the guy who leans on John's sense of duty when it comes to weeding out the deep state's involvement in human trafficking.




IMPORTANCE OF THE SERIES

'Sheepdogs' are a true-life, nearly invisible American subculture of good people - private citizens who simply want to live free and be left alone. But if trouble ever comes, they're the first ones to step up to defend themselves and others.

This action-drama incorporates the impact of emotional, physical, and spiritual trauma on the lives of our characters. Who these people are, what they stand for, and how they navigate adversity makes Sheepdog relatable & inspirational. Drawing from events we see in the news every day, told from a point of view that honors and respects those who put their lives on the line makes Sheepdog unique and relevant.

Being a Sheepdog is a philosophy typically held by first responders and war veterans, but also every day citizens who feel compelled to defend themselves and others. These are every-day heroes - people whose unique perspective and daily experience have rarely been accurately reflected in media. These types of men and women, these "Sheepdogs", create their own safespace by being willing to always stand between you and the 'wolf.' They do this at great risk to themselves, sometimes, even facing death. They don't seek glory or fame. It's just who they are. It's in their DNA. They're easy to spot. Just look for the guys running in, when everyone else is running out.




David Christopher
